<p><b>12 hours: The East fire will continue to spread to back down East Ridge towards the Eel River. Planned activities will be to keep the fire west of East Ridge and continue to monitor fire spread and scout opportunities to carry fire south on Buck Ridge.</b></p>
<p><b>24 hours: A slight cooling trend will begin Monday, and this will continue through the middle of next week. Humidity will remain generally low through Monday and no precipitation is expected.</b></p>
<p><b>48 hours: A slight cooling trend will begin Monday, and this will continue through the middle of next week. Humidity will remain generally low through Monday and no precipitation is expected.</b></p>
<p><b>72 hours: No immediate threat to any significant values at risk or values to be protected is expected. Humidities are expected to rise during the week perhaps slowing fire spread and limiting fire activity.</b></p>
<p><b>Anticipated after 72 hours: Fire should remain in the Yolla Bolly Wilderness area. Additional Management Action Points will be identified along with control lines.</b></p>

Conduct all fire management activities within the wilderness in a manner compatible with overall wilderness management activities.
